Students are categorised based on the streams of studies and also according to their core subjects. They are divided into groups of 10-15 depending on the number of students. Each group is assigned a teacher-mentor who would perform mentoring duties. A Mentoring Format with Guidelines is prepared by the IQAC to ensure uniformity. Mentors maintain and update the Mentoring Format which contains space for entering particulars and performance of students (class tests, monthly attendance records, etc.) After collecting all necessary information, Mentors are expected to offer guidance and counselling, as and when required. It is the practice of Mentors to meet students individually or in groups. In isolated cases parents are called for counselling/special meetings with the Principal at the suggestion of the Mentor. If a student is identified as having weakness in particular subject, it is the duty of the Mentor to apprise the concerned subject teacher. Targets achieved The Remedial Classes have been institutionalised after the implementation of the Mentoring System. Need-Based remedial classes have proved to be beneficial to the students in particular and the entire college in general. The institutional practice of Mentoring System has considerably enhanced the campus environment and brought about: Enhanced contact hours between Mentors with their respective students Improvement in students' attendance records Minimised student drop-out rates (apparently due to Mentors' intervention before a student falls short of attendance or has been regularly abstaining from classes) Identification of slow learners for conducting Remedial Classes Advanced learners identified and encouraged with incentive prizes.
